

Getting a Location Compliance Certificate

You need to get a Location Compliance Certificate (LCC) if you store more than a set quantity of LPG on your site.

Who needs to read this

You need a Location Compliance Certificate (LCC) if:

- On a workplace site you store 100kg or more of LPG.
- On a non-workplace site you store over 300kg of LPG.

You won't need an LCC if Rockgas issues you a compliance plaque. We can do this if you are a non-workplace and have between 100kg and 300kg. Talk to us about getting a plaque.

Getting your LCC

To get a new LCC or renew your LCC prior to expiry, contact your Compliance Certifier or click here for the WorkSafe list of Compliance Certifiers compliancecertifiers.worksafe.govt.nz. You should book well in advance. You'll need a certifier who can certify class 2.1.1.

Once you have your LCC, be sure to email a copy to LCC@rockgas.co.nz so that we can supply you.

Things the Compliance Certifier will look for

If you are unsure or have any questions, please consult your Certifier.

Use this checklist as a guide to help prepare for your LCC.

Site plans, must include

- Hazardous areas and Separation distances
- Hazardous substances locations, with distance to boundaries

Fire suppression, if needed

- Correct number of fire extinguishers or hose reels

Hazardous substances register

- List of hazardous substances on site
- Quantity and management of substances

Hazardous substances storage

- Hazardous substances stored safely and securely, depending on class
- Incompatible substances stored separately

Documentation

- Emergency Response Plan – tested every 12 months
- LPG Safety Data Sheet – current within 5 years www.rockgas.co.nz/staying-safe/
- Staff training records

Signage

- Signage – eg Hazchem

Your certifier may ask for

- Maintenance records
- Electrical certificate, if electrical equipment in the hazardous areas
- Pressure inspection certificate (PECPR) if you have a tank
- Safe work procedures

Sorry but...

- If you don't have an LCC or it expires, we can **not** supply LPG to you.
- We will **not** supply you if we think it will put you over your LCC limit.
